All our children learn about the world around them as part of the Early Years Foundation Stage framework we deliver at Happy Hours. As well as learning literacy and numeracy, children need to be able to make sense of the world surrounding them if they are to develop fully."

Happy Hours Nursery, which celebrates its twenty - first anniversary in November, has two locations in Nailsea and Yatton offering weekday childcare from 7:30 am to 6 pm for parents with children aged between three months and five years.
